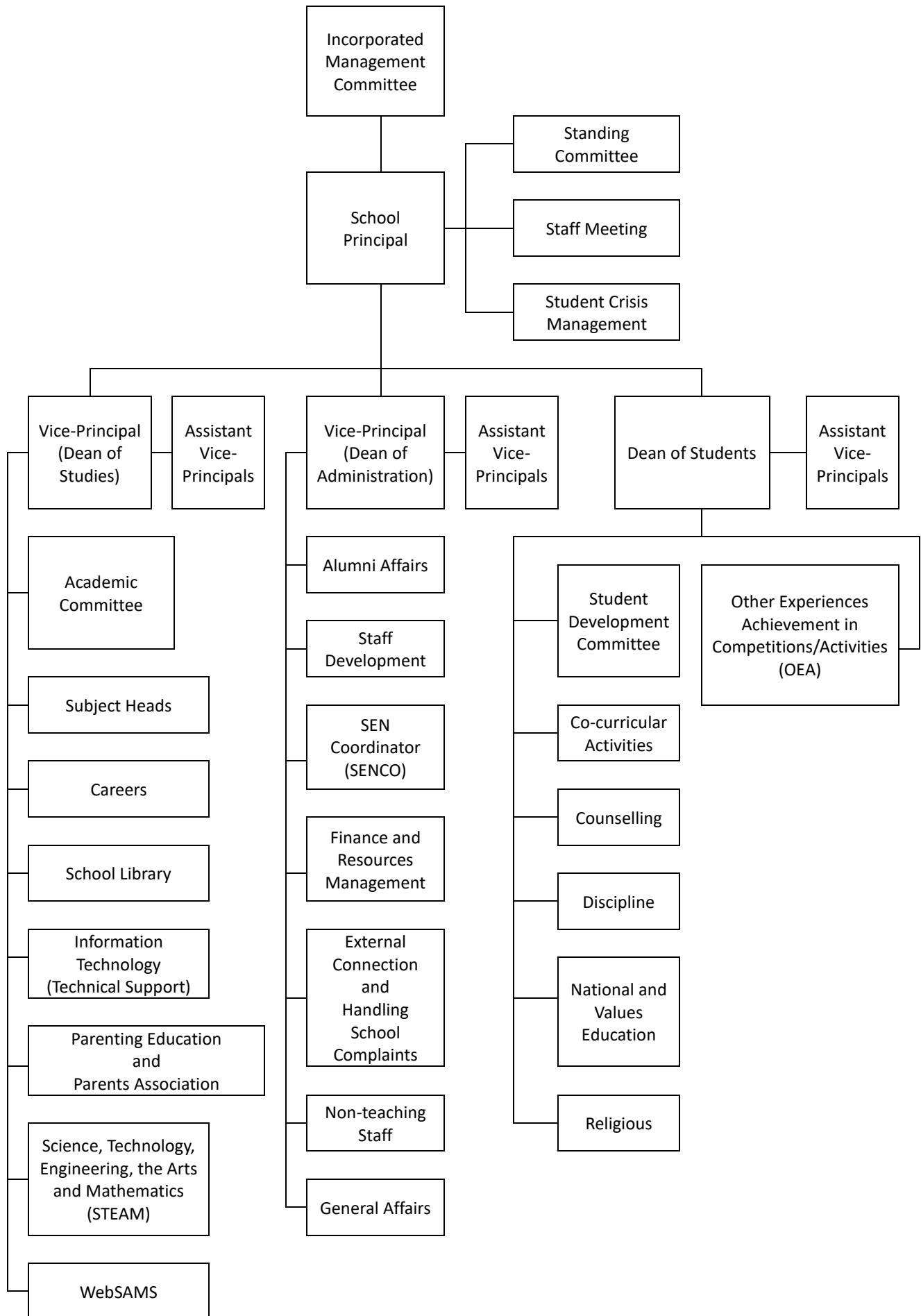

School Administration Chart

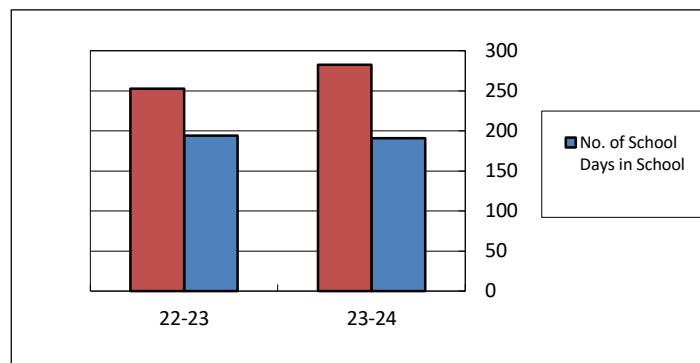

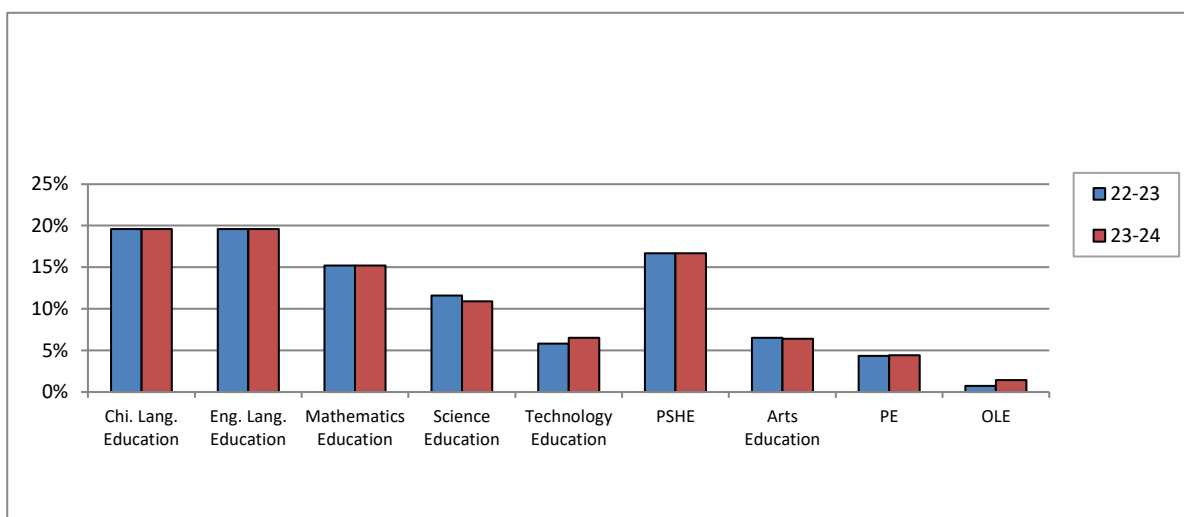

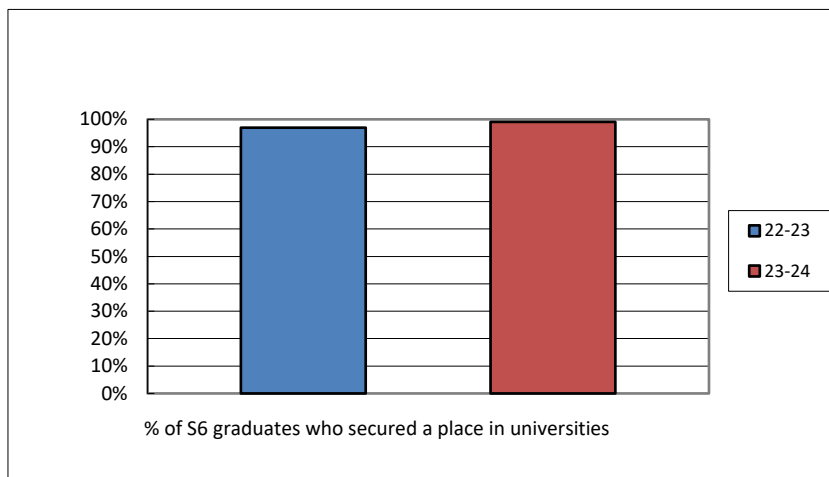

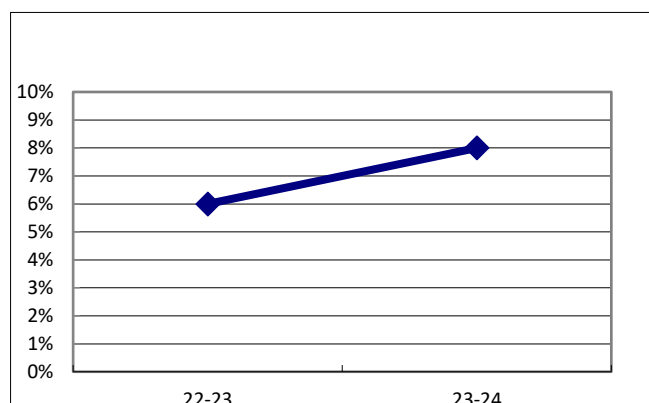

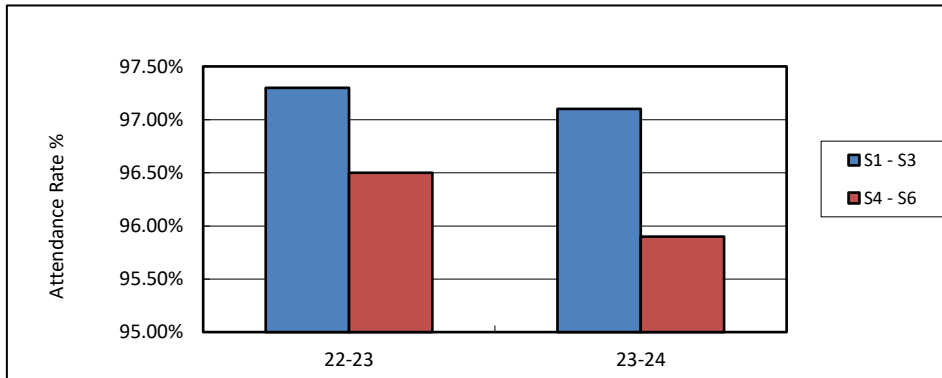
- Percentage of S6 graduates who have secured a place in universities or tertiary institutions (Including Degree, Associate Degree and Higher Diploma courses)



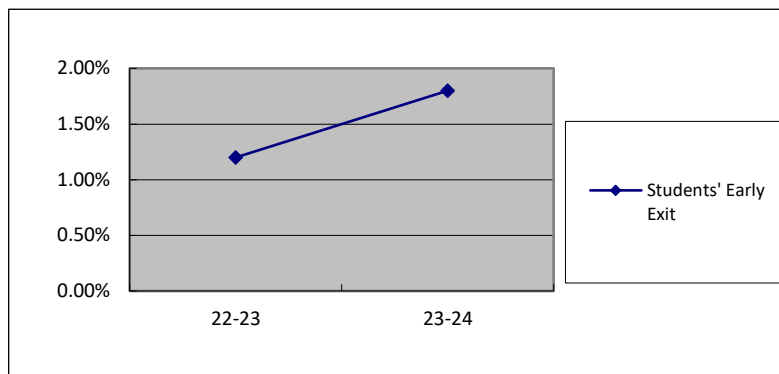
Unfilled Places in the past 2 years

Students' Early Exit in the past 2 years



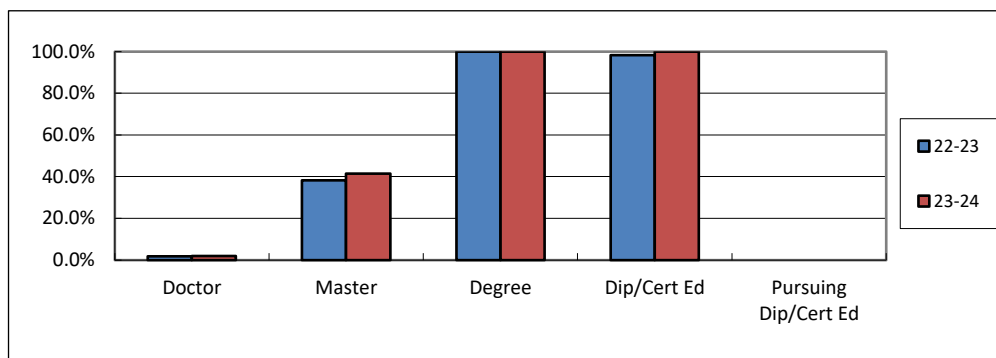

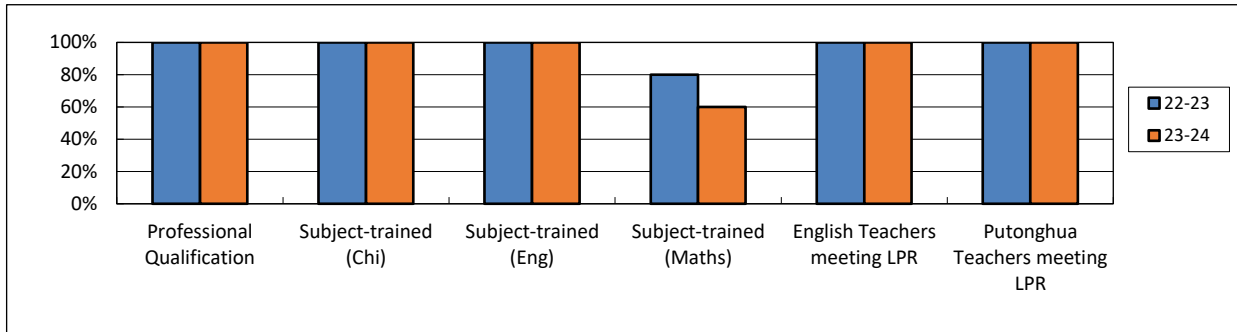

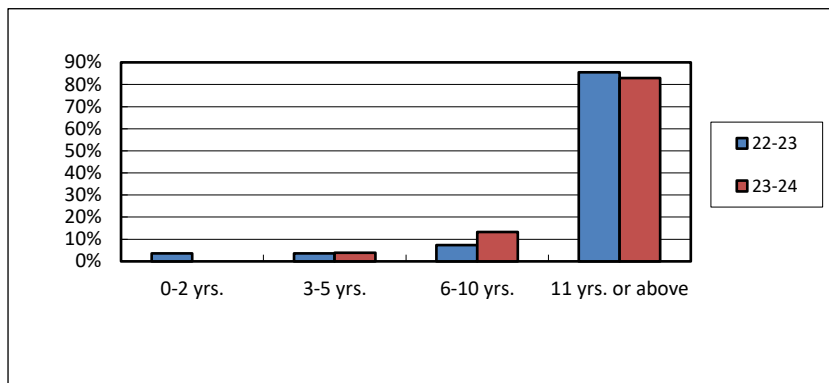

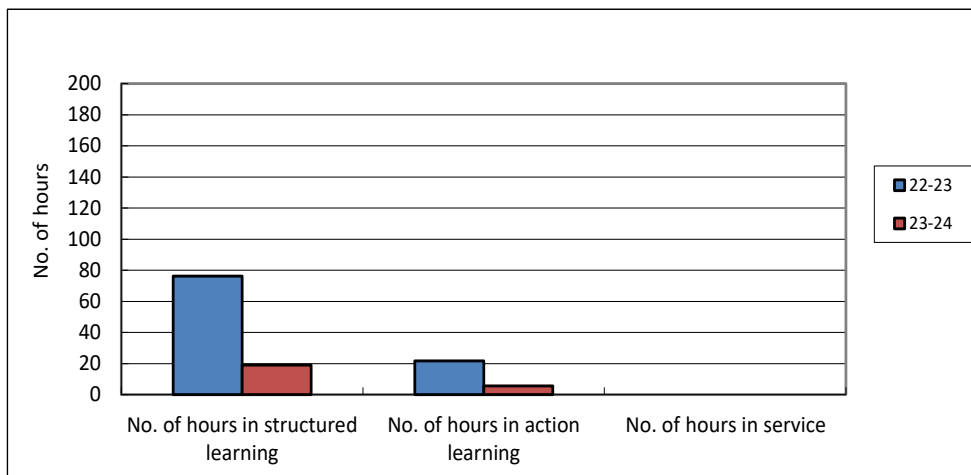


Teachers' Teaching Experience in the past 2 years

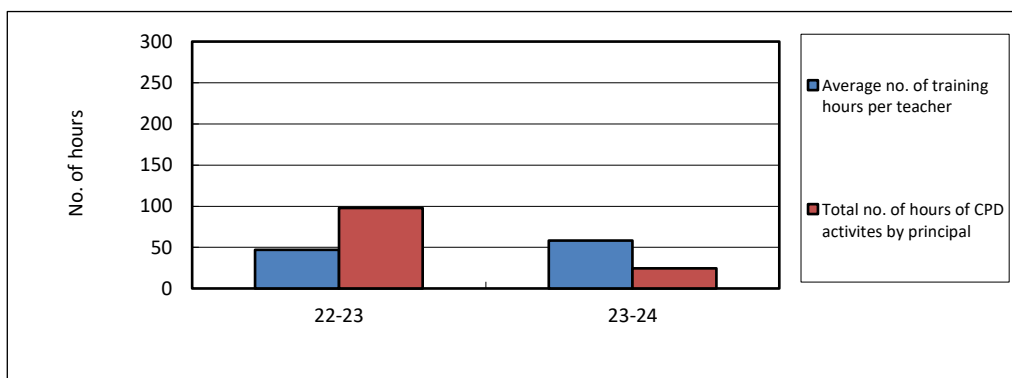

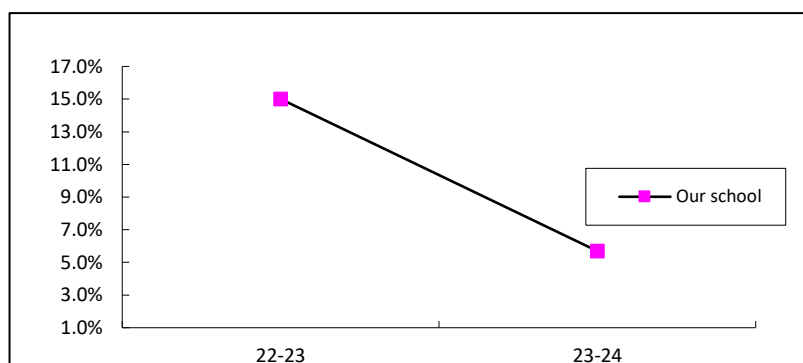
- Principal's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) in the past 2 years. (Number of hours in activities related to structured learning, action learning and service to education and the community.)

Major Concerns 2024-2025 (Strategies, Success Criteria, Actual Progress & Follow-up Suggestions)

Major Concern 1: Nurturing students to be self-directed learners and catering for their diverse learning needs

Achievements

Area 1: Improve students' self-directed learning skills through reading and note-taking

- One reading period was implemented into the school timetable for F.1 and F.2 students.
- Reading / activities Across the Curriculum (RaC / AaC) were arranged in all subjects.
- Promoting reading through DEAR periods, reading across the curriculum in all subjects, library activities and reading periods.
- Book sharing by teachers and students have been done throughout the year during the DEAR periods.
- Improve students' self-directed learning skills and train F1 and F2 students for their note-taking skills by our teachers. Two workshops are arranged in the first term of the academic year:
 - F.1 workshop: 26/9/2023
 - F.2 workshop: 3/10/2023
- Encourage students to design their personalized learning method, provide tools and materials for students to be self-directed learners.

Area 2: Cater for the diverse learning needs of students

- In-depth group discussion and provoking questions were incorporated in the lessons. Various means of tasks and assessment to cater for diverse students' learning needs are adopted.
- Formal lesson observations and peer observations with the focus of catering for the diversified learning were arranged in a large scale.
- Peer learning groups among students from the same class or from the same house were established.
- Various learning support programmes for gifted students and low achievers were provided.
- Effective pedagogies or good practices at department level were shared.

Reflection

- All subjects have designed subject-based reading and cross-curriculum reading activities.
- Workshops on note-taking skills for F.1 and F.2 students have been conducted (26/9/2023 and 3/10/2023) successfully. In the evaluation survey, 87.9% of students applied the note-taking skills they learned in the workshop. 87.7% of students felt more confident in the ability to take effective notes after attending the workshop.
- The borrowing rate of books in School Library is 18.83 item /day in the school year 2022-23. The rate was 18.66 item / day in the school year 2023-24. E-Book Reading Rate is sharply increased from 4679 times in 2022-23 to 29233 times in 2023-24.
- In the Stakeholders' Survey, 47.2% of the students showed that "I often read materials such as leisure reading materials and newspapers outside class." and 38.9% of the parents showed that "My child likes reading."
- In the Stakeholders' Survey, students have positive feedback on learning:
 - 55.8% of students showed that "I take an active role in learning inside and outside of the classroom."
 - 46.2% of students showed that "I am confident in learning inside and outside of the classroom."
 - 40.8% of students showed that "I enjoy learning inside and outside of the classroom."
 - 58.4% of students showed that "I often complete learning tasks, including homework, seriously."
 - 47.2% of students showed that "I often read materials such as leisure reading materials and newspapers outside class."
 - 53.4% of students showed that "I know how to set my own learning goals."

- 52.7% of students showed that “I know how to apply learning strategies, such as doing pre-lesson preparation, using concept maps and on-line resources.”
- 62.1% of students showed that “I often reflect on my performance in class, test and examination results, as well as teachers' suggestions, such as their comments on my assignments, in order to reflect on and improve my learning.”
- In the Stakeholders’ Survey:
 - 64.9% of students showed that “The teachers often teach us learning strategies, such as doing pre-lesson preparation, using concept maps and on-line resources.”
 - 64.2% of students showed that “Teachers often provide suggestions on my performance and let me know how to improve.”
 - 62.6% of students showed that “Teachers’ questions inspire my thinking inside and outside of the classroom.”
 - 64.6% of students showed that “Teachers often allow us to explore a variety of topics inside and outside of the classroom.”
 - 61.2% of students showed that “Teachers often organise different learning activities both inside and outside of the classroom, such as discussion, visits, sharing of insights gained from reading and oral presentation.

Feedback and Follow-up

Our school goes through a planning, implementation, and evaluation (PIE) process every year. By evaluating the 2023-24 annual plan, which is the second year of the Three-year Development Plan (2022-25), follow-up actions are taken in the coming academic year.

- To improve students’ self-directed learning skills through reading and note-taking.
 - Workshops on note-taking skills for F.1 and F.2 students would be conducted by Chinese, English, Science and PSHE teachers.
 - Book sharing of teachers and students during the DEAR periods.
 - Reading period would be implemented into the school timetable for F.2 students.
 - More reading activities and reading promotion from library and academic departments.

Major Concern 2: Promoting positive values education and good mental health to help students live a purposeful life

 - 56.3% of students agreed that “My schoolmates respect the teachers.”

- 93% of student participants of fellowship agreed the awareness of the need of positive values were uplifted.

- 66.0% of teachers agreed that “The student support services offered by the school cater for students' development needs.”

- 31.61%, 30.65% and 22.07% of students got Gold, Silver and Bronze Award respectively in the 2nd term which the result was like that in the 1st term.
- 74% of student participants of fellowship agreed they could relieve stress through the activities.

Reflection

- The element “Benevolence” was optimised and “Unity”, “Filial Piety” were newly added that the planning of the curriculum must consider all the twelve priority values and attitudes. They will be clearly stated in the teaching progress of all subjects.
- Understanding the importance to instil positive values in students and promote mental health, lots of activities or programmes were implemented to promote positive values education and mental health that helping students live a purposeful life.
- Through various learning activities related to national education, students have a strong sense of national identity which is the same as last school year.
- With the pandemic having ended, normal school life is gradually allowing students to return to their regular social lives, providing more opportunities for discussions with teachers and support from peers. Students’ recognition of benevolence is uplifted as the Q-score of the subscale “School Atmosphere (Not Lonely)” is higher than that of last school year.
- Students have a strong sense of morality and are honest. However, they are weak to abide by the law and regulations. Students in general recognize the schoolmates should behave well. The findings are similar to the last school year. More efforts should be made to educate students about good discipline.
- Students possess a significant ability to persist in the face of challenges or difficulties in learning.
- Students should be aware of doing more physical exercise, sleep more and have less time played on electronic devices. Meanwhile, they are not addicted to electronic devices.
- Students are fear to face failure and may be with anxiety, depressive symptoms.
- Students find meaningful in life and with no negative affect in general.
- Students have normal social behaviours with friends.
- Students’ emotional stability and relationship with same sex improve a lot. However, their self-concept concerning the physical appearance and relationship with opposite sex lower, especially the latter. Students need to enhance their self-confidence.

Feedback and Follow-up

- More planning work involving the teaching of the self-discipline of students should be done. The school’s disciplinary management should be effective and appropriate reward and punishment measures should be implemented well such that students develop habits of respect. Teachers should strictly follow school regulations to give students appropriate rewards and punishments. This is one of the ways to guide students in establishing the correct set of values.
- According to the EDB Circular Memo No. 105/2024, the emphasis on “courtesy” among students should be encouraged to be further strengthened through school-based learning activities.
- Continuous efforts should be made to assist students in having healthy lifestyles.

- Teachers should care for the growth needs of students and have regular communication with them.
- “Mental Health@School” 4Rs Mental Health Charter would be signed up so that mental health in schools could be promoted in a more comprehensive and systematic manner.

With the support of our students, children in the Shek Lei community were helped voice their views and put forward their innovative solutions to issues about transportation and play space. • Collaborated with Adventure Ship Trainers and The Hong Kong Society of the Blind, Counselling Action Group arranged the 'Adventure Ship Buddies Program' which aimed at providing an opportunity to our students and people with special needs to have a positive interaction. The programme included a volunteer-service training workshop, an inclusion orientation program between our students and the members of The Hong Kong Society of the Blind, an adventure ship training day and, the evaluation and sharing session. • Members of Girl Guides participated in a raffle selling day, two flag hoisting ceremony on 4 May and 1 July 2023, and social inclusion with the elderly, through which they learnt to serve the community with a sense of responsibility and gratitude.

This initiative aimed to foster creativity and connection between generations. At the Neighbourhood Elderly Centre, the students engaged the elderly in the soothing and expressive art of Pastel Nagomi. The vibrant colours and gentle techniques encouraged participants to share stories, fostering a warm and joyful atmosphere. Many elderly participants expressed delight in creating art, while students learnt valuable lessons in patience and empathy. • Sixteen students joined the volunteer service '躍動成長路-義工服務日' at the Heep Hong Society Jockey Club STAR Resource Centre. This event was designed to support families with children who have ADHD by providing a series of interactive game booths.
